A J	Trooper	Derbyshire Dragoons	He joined in October 1916, and after having completed his training served at various stations on important duties until October 1918, when he was drafted to Russia. Here he took part in numerous engagements and was wounded. In November 1919, he returned to England, and was demobilised holding the General Service and Victory Medals. 89, Wickerley Road, Lavender Hill, SW11.	Z1060	?	Ancestry
G	Corporal	Royal Field Artillery	He volunteered in August 1914, and in the following month proceeded to the Western Front, where was in action in numerous important engagements. Whilst taking part in the Battle of the Somme, he was severely wounded in July 1916, and was invalided home. Discharged owing to wounds in February 1917, he holds the 1914 Star, and the General and Victory Medals. 51, Princess Street, Rusholme, Manchester.	Z1055	?	Ancestry
G H	Private	Labour Corps	He joined in March 1917, and was soon sent overseas. On the Western Front he served in the engagements at Arras, Amiens, Cambrai, Armentières and Messines and in the Retreat of 1918, and was wounded. He was demobilised in March 1919, and holds the General Service and Victory Medals. 4/35 Henley Street, Camp Hill, Birmingham.	X1117	?	Ancestry
George	Private	7th West Yorkshire Regiment	He volunteered at the outbreak of war, and shortly afterwards proceeded to the Western Front, where he took part in some of the earlier engagements, including the Battles La Bassée and Ypres. He gave his life for the freedom of England in the Battle of Festubert on May 22nd, 1915, and was entitled to the 1914 Star, and the General Service and Victory Medals. "And doubtless he went in splendid company." 19 Sussex Avenue, Hunslet, Leeds.	1092B	?	Ancestry
H J	Pioneer	Royal Engineers	He joined in August 1916, and in the following November was drafted to the Western Front, where he was employed with the Special Gas Section at Beaumont-Hamel, Bourlon Wood, Amiens, and St. Omer. He also served in the Advance of 1918, and after the conclusion of hostilities returned to England, and was demobilised in March 1919 holding the General Service and Victory Medals. 12, Comyn Road, Battersea, SW11. J C	Special War Worker	N/A	He volunteered for special war work, and was engaged on work of much National importance in making axles for gun carriages. He rendered valuable services and gave complete satisfaction to the Authorities. 12, Recreation View, Holbeck, Leeds.	X1093	?	Ancestry
S R	Special War Worker	N/A	Volunteering in September 1914, he was employed on work of National importance for four years in the manufacture of shells at Messrs. Wilson & Matherson, Armley. He rendered services of a very valuable nature, giving complete satisfaction to his employers until November 1918. 1, Theaker Place, Armley, Leeds	X1094	?	Ancestry
T H	Private	Royal Air Force	He joined on October 29th 1915, and was sent to the Western Front. He was transferred to the Tank Corps during the period of service. He was discharged in May, 1919, holding the General Service and Victory Medals. 30, Colehill Lane, Fulham, SW6.	X18908	?	Ancestry
W	Private	Manchester Regiment	Volunteering in August 1914, he first saw active service in the Dardanelles, where he took part in the Landing at Cape Helles and the three Battles of Krithia. After the Evacuation of the Gallipoli Peninsula, he was sent to Egypt, and stationed at Alexandria and Khartoum, was engaged on garrison duty. Later he proceeded to the Western Front and fought at Arras, Ypres, Passchendaele and in the Retreat and Advance of 1918, being gassed in action at Ypres. He was demobilised in February 1919, and holds the 1914-15 Star, and the General Service and Victory Medals. 27, Park Place, Hulme, Manchester.	Z5519	?	Ancestry
